REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Welcome to Kelowna and this new decade with a new beginning for this Association! Many thanks to Al Peatt, Conference Committee Chair, for this outstanding Conference! Thanks also to our many sponsors that have contributed to this success. My hope is that they too see success continuing to support us.

Your Board of Directors and staff have been very busy this past year. Now is the time I reflect on those activities to report out to our members. My first reflection is to you, our members, who have stepped forward with their financial support to ensure we continue to assist one another in our profession.

Up to this point, APB staff have been funded by the College and under the terms of the APB/College MOU have been available to us on an “as required and as available basis”. Staff has been very supportive with our transition to independence this year, acting as our financial agent in collecting dues and ensuring membership matters remain separate from the public interest of the College. As this is our last year under the MOU, this is the last time that you will see this staff affiliated with us and I ask all to acknowledge the work they have done with sincere thanks.

Committee Chair reports follow my opening. At this time I extend my gratitude for their volunteer efforts and performance. This is the where things are done and not in independence. Committee Chairs rely heavily on their committee members – many who participate with their own dedication resulting in tasks well done. I ask for your acknowledgement of thanks to everyone for this support.

This coming year will see many changes for this Association. I know we will have some difficulty in always taking forward steps. The corporate knowledge and support of our present staff will be hard to replace so please accept my apologies now. Bear with us as we transform into a more responsive organization to our members. At the time of writing this, your Board is actively completing the selection of a Managing Director to undertake the day-to-day activities an organization with well over a thousand members needs to do. We need to do what has been done previously and still do more in the coming months to advance our Association further.

This Association will be moving into a new virtual office. We have targeted July 1st as our opening and complete separation from the College. The new and full Board of Directors will be meeting in June to confirm our new contact information, select an Executive and appoint Committee Chairs. We will be updating our website with these details as they are confirmed. Watch for these details and more.

I'm looking forward to the changes coming. My hope is that you too will welcome them and support where they take us. Much needs to be done in this new year: our new name, revise our by-laws, maintain what we have and make many improvements along the way. I welcome your involvement as any organization will only be as strong as their membership supports.

In concluding my President's message: I heard a comment from someone that this Association is much like a parent who was successful in establishing the College as if it was their offspring –giving them

everything they had. The College is now of age and is letting us go our separate way. There were 6 Board meetings and several committee meetings held during this last term. Minutes of all Board meetings are available at the Association office. On behalf of the Board I would like to thank Association staff for their capable assistance in preparing meeting agendas, materials and minutes.

Financial Audit

Because of the impending separation of the APB from the College, annual membership dues in the ABP were set at \$85 for most membership categories (and \$25 for students) for 2010. At this time most College members have taken up membership in the APB.

The recently completed audit of the APBBC 2009 finances indicate the Association's financial affairs continue to be managed in accordance with sound accounting practices, with receipts and expenditures being properly documented. The audited financial statement is included in this AGM booklet. The present Auditor has a good understanding of our Association and I recommend that C. F. Loveless be appointed Auditor for the 2010 fiscal year.

Finances

Funding for budget year 2009 was accomplished via a grant from the College, some of which was offset by additional revenue from advertising.

Office Management

Office management and staffing over the period of this report was provided by the College at no cost to the APB, and the Association's needs continue to be met as a result of this arrangement. This will change in 2010 as the APB expects, as part of its move to full independence from the College, with the concurrence of the College to terminate the College/APB MOU in July 2010 and become financially responsible for its own staff and services.

I would like to extend my thanks to Simon Woo, Kelly McLaughlin as well as Linda Michaluk and Linda Stordeur for their outstanding service.

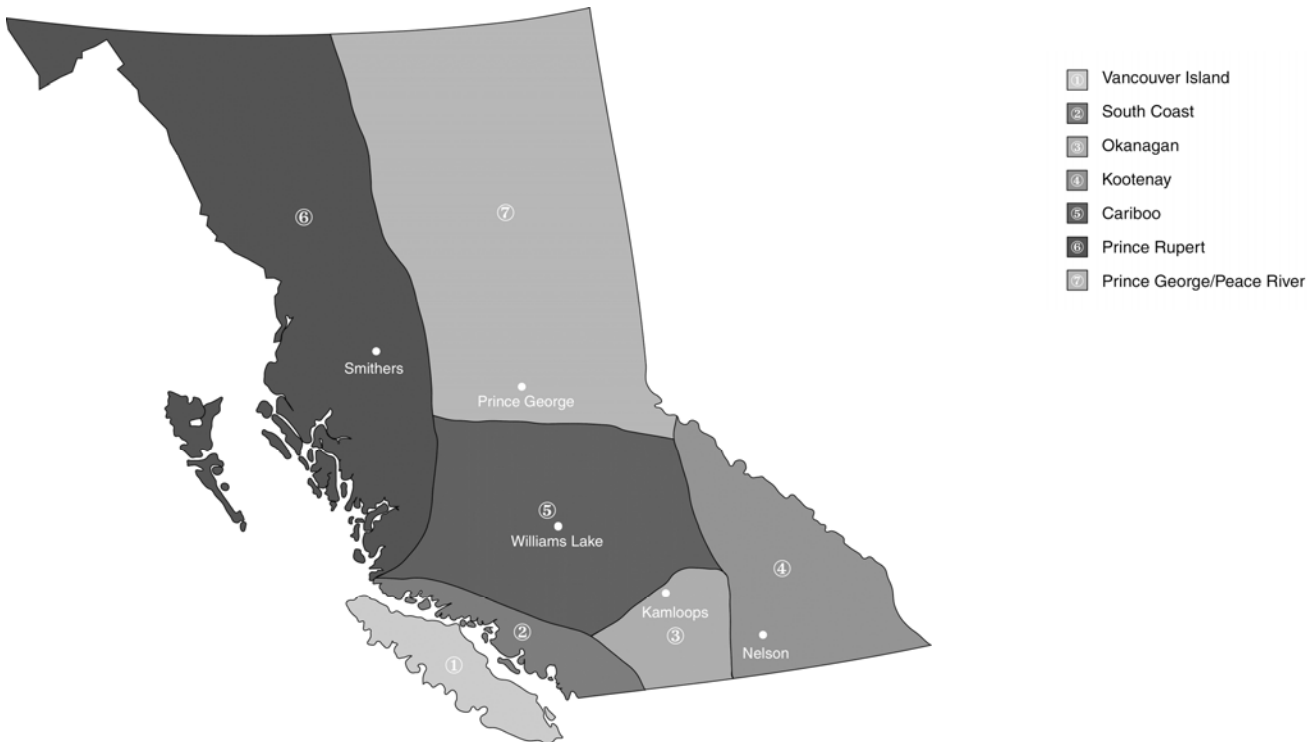

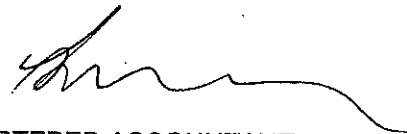
AUDITOR'S REPORT

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Year ended December 31

1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The Association of Professional Biologists of British Columbia (APB) is incorporated under the Society Act (British Columbia), and its principal activity is to support the application of sound biological principles in the management and conservation of resources in British Columbia. APB is an exempt entity under the Income Tax Act.

2. DESCRIPTION OF FUNDS

Operating Fund

This fund is used for all administrative and operational activities of the Association of Professional Biologists of British Columbia.

3. CAPITAL ASSETS

The association follows a policy of recording capital assets as a current expenditure. Capital assets consist exclusively of office equipment.

4. OPERATING GRANT FROM THE COLLEGE OF APPLIED BIOLOGY

By agreement between the parties, the College of Applied Biology (CAB) will provide an annual grant to cover operating and overhead costs of the Association of Professional Biologists of British Columbia (APB). The annual general meetings of both the APB and CAB are held in conjunction with the Annual Applied Biology Conference which is organized by the APB. The APB will receive any profit from the conference. The profit will be used to decrease the amount of the grant from the CAB. The CAB will be responsible for any losses incurred as a result of the conference, and this amount will be shown as part of the annual grant to the APB.

5. DUES RECEIVABLE FROM THE COLLEGE OF APPLIED BIOLOGY

The College of Applied Biology (CAB) Collected 2010 dues for the Association of Professional Biologists of British Columbia (APB) in 2009. This deferred revenue will be paid to the APB in 2010.

This year has once again been a busy year for the Communications and Networking Committee!

Our focus has continued to be improving and increasing communications amongst the members of the Association of Professional Biologists (APB) of British Columbia and with other applicable parties (industry, government, NGOs, academia and professional organizations). Our communication tools include the APB website (www.apbbc.bc.ca), BioNews, BioServe, BioNotice, Regional Meetings, Roadshows and the **new Mentorship Program**. These all serve to inform, to educate, to increase membership interaction and to improve professional networking opportunities.

In the last year, the APB website continued to be a solid conduit of information for our members. We are currently working on allowing only APB member access to several of our offered benefits (e.g., free advertising listings on our consultant's page, affinity program, current job postings site and mentorship program). You can expect this tool to be expanded and relied on more frequently in the future as we use online voting and payments.

As the editor of BioNews, I am pleased to introduce the new "Perspectives" section of BioNews which presents different professional viewpoints on biological issues currently impacting British Columbian ecosystems. Our first focus topic was "Marine Aquaculture Management in Coastal British Columbia" and we look forward to other interesting and timely perspectives over the coming year.

As discussed at the 2009 APBBC AGM, the APB is moving towards financial independence from the College of Applied Biology (CAB); our Memorandum of Understanding with

the CAB is set to expire in November 2010. As such, the APB Board of Directors has taken steps to focus more energies and finances on improving our communications and networking opportunities in the next year. We are looking to hire a Managing Director to assist in several of the communications and networking duties. As always, we will strive to have an up to date website and robust BioNews publication with timely, relevant articles and discussion pieces. We appreciate any comments and constructive criticism from our membership as we move forward on this initiative.

I would again like thank Linda Stordeur and Simon Woo for their excellent work in supervising and coordinating the production of BioNews and continually updating sections of the website in a timely manner. As well a great "Thank you" to the other members of the Communications and Networking Committee: Dave Polster, Astrid van Woudenberg and Pam Zevit with their help in various editorial duties.

And, just a gentle reminder that Regional Meetings are an excellent way to gain mandatory CPD credits while networking with your fellow biologists. Please phone the office or contact me if you have interest in organizing your own Regional Meeting in your area; we have resources and some funding to facilitate the event.

PRACTICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Chair Eric White, RPBio

This past year saw the completion and adoption of the "*Members Guide to the College Audit Process*". This is now posted on the APB website and is available to all members.

This guide presents the membership with the background, rationale and purpose (as we understand them) behind the CAB audit. The document will provide an explanation of the purpose of the audit process (it is not just a "gotcha" exercise), the implications of the various outcomes (what if I don't "measure" up??!) and a flowchart of the process. It includes a copy of the audit interview form and explanation of the questions. It also presents further information regarding current standard practices – in other words, some guidance as to what is needed to bring your practice into compliance with the CAB expectations.

Readers are cautioned that this document is not sanctioned or vetted by the College. This is your Association's best effort to give you the best advice we can; however, there is no guarantee that if you follow all the guidance in the document that you will, in fact, be home free if/when you are audited. Read: holding up the APB members guide and saying "I did all this stuff!" is not going to get you off the hook.

Next up for the committee is a similar guide to the discipline process. This will present information on what kinds of infractions might incur an action from the College, what the process is in resolving the resultant proceedings, what the possible outcomes are and the consequences of those outcomes.

MENTORSHIP STEERING COMMITTEE**Co-Chairs: Megan Hanacek RPBio and Eric White, RPBio**

This past year saw the implementation and launch of the APB mentorship web page. This has been several years in the development and it gives us (the committee as a whole) great satisfaction to see it up and running.

The web page was launched in January 2010 and, at the time of writing; we have 14 protégées and 5 mentors, with one active mentor/protégée pair. Best wishes to all!

The users of this service are reminded that it is set up primarily to be self-administered and self guided. Once you have signed up it is up to you to contact potential mentors or protégées and engage them in a relationship. Both parties can structure their interactions as they see fit (i.e. whatever works best for the two of you). We ask that you advise the program when you have engaged in a relationship, and with whom, and provide some (informal) information as to what type of interaction you engage in.

We invite your feedback – what works, what could be made better. We also encourage established biologists to consider the benefits of taking on a protégée and participating in the program.

We would also like to remind you that this program is a direct result of Ted Harding's vision and last wishes. The program is supported by the Ted Harding Memorial Fund, which was established after his passing 2005. Charitable donations (i.e. tax deductible) to the fund can be made through the Association office.

AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS COMMITTEE**Chair Debbi Stanver, RPBio**

The Ian McTaggart-Cowan Award for Excellence in Biology was presented to Dr. Fred L. Bunnell. This award recognizes individuals who have significantly contributed to the biological sciences in B.C. Among his numerous achievements and contributions, Dr. Bunnell was the founding director of the Centre for Applied Conservation Research at the University of British Columbia and pioneered the undergraduate program in broad resource conservation in the UBC Faculty of Forestry. This program was formalized in 1996 as a B.Sc. of Natural Resources Conservation. Over the past 39 years, Dr. Bunnell has authored or co-authored about 250 refereed papers, a similar number of non-refereed conference proceedings and reports to government and industry, and edited 7 books. He has published on a diverse range of species including bacteria, algae, lichens, bryophytes, marine invertebrates, vascular plants, amphibians, birds and mammals. Dr. Bunnell retired as a full Professor in 2004, and currently holds the position of Professor Emeritus at UBC.

RESOLUTION POLICY

A. Rules of Procedure

1. A public policy resolution must be received 28 days in advance of the AGM, unless the Board unanimously agree to waive that requirement (Bylaw 20(b)).
2. A resolution must be moved and seconded before discussion on the resolution.
3. A member wishing to move, second or speak to a motion shall stand and address the Chair, and shall wait until recognized before speaking. The member must announce their name prior to speaking.
4. A member must confine their remarks to a maximum speaking period of two minutes. The mover of a motion is permitted three minutes. The time constraints will be waived by the Chair where there is general agreement by the assembly.
5. No member may speak more than once on any question unless and until all other members desiring to speak have been heard.
6. Any amendment and any motion to withdraw any resolution from consideration of the meeting or to refer the motion to the Board or any committee must be moved and seconded from the floor.
7. Should discussion continue on any resolution for an undue length of time without reasonable agreement being reached, the resolution may be cleared from the floor by a favourable vote to refer the resolution to the Board for further consideration and report.

B. Handling of Resolutions

1. The Chair shall read the title of the resolution to be dealt with by the assembly
2. The Chair will call for the resolution to be read aloud to the assembly
3. The Chair will call for any recommendation from the Board to be read aloud
4. The Chair will call for a mover and seconder for the resolution
5. In the event the Board or has recommended an amendment to the motion, the Chair will call for a mover and seconder for the amendment.
6. In the event the Board or has recommended a motion to replace the motion submitted with the resolution, the Chair will call for a mover and seconder for the resolution once the submitted resolution has been addressed (i.e. either fails for lack of a mover and seconder, is withdrawn, is referred, or is defeated).
7. The Chair will call for discussion on the motion.
8. The Chair will call the question on the motion.
9. Voting on the resolution will be as addressed in APB Bylaws 22 and 23 (i.e. only registered members can vote, voting by proxy is not allowed, and at anytime before or after the counting of the results 3 voting members can request a letter ballot be conducted on the question).

AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIPS

THE IAN MCTAGGART-COWAN AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN BIOLOGY:

This award is presented periodically to a member in good standing of the APBBC in recognition of a significant contribution to the applied biological sciences in BC. This award is not an annual award, but is granted when a member, or in exceptional circumstances two or three members, have made an outstanding contribution to applied biology.

W. YOUNG AWARD FOR INTEGRATED RESOURCE MANAGEMENT:

This award, sponsored jointly with the Association of BC Forest Professionals, honours a BC individual or association that has demonstrated significant accomplishments in integrated fisheries, forestry or wildlife-forestry management.

THE BIOLOGIST OF THE YEAR AWARD:

This award is distinct from the Award for Excellence in Biology in that it recognizes shorter term contributions to applied biological science and the application of applied biology in a local or regional area. The award is presented at the Annual General Meeting for outstanding contributions by a member or a team to applied biology and to the advancement of professional biology. The basic requirement shall be the application of applied biology to resource management, to education, to research, to advancement of the profession, for service to the Association or service to his or her local community.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARDS:

The Board of Directors of the APBBC each year honours those members of the Association who have made contributions to the APB which are outstanding, above and beyond the contributions normally expected of members. These contributions should be in association with the setting and achievement of goals of the APBBC and the advancement of the Association as a professional organization. The recipients will be acknowledged at the Annual General Meeting each year, and their service will be recorded on a meritorious service plaque in the office of the APBBC in Victoria.

TWENTY YEAR MEMBERSHIPS:

To mark the 20th anniversary of the Association in 2000, Professional Biologists who have retained membership in the Association for 20 consecutive years are awarded the Association's Special Service gold pin.

APB SCHOLARSHIPS: The scholarship may be awarded to a student who is *related to* a member in good standing of the Association, or who is a Student Member, Biologist In Training, or RPBio in good standing, of the APB. The award will be given to an undergraduate who is entering the third or fourth year of an undergraduate program, or to a BIT or RPBio entering post-graduate studies in a program that leads to a degree in Biology (or a closely related area as specified in the membership guidelines). Up to 2 \$1000 scholarships (one scholarship per person) may be awarded in a given year.

ENVIRONMENTAL DAMAGES FUND SCHOLARSHIPS:

The scholarships were awarded to students who were enrolled full time in a post secondary institution in South East BC in a program leading to registration with the College. For the 2008/09 school term, 4 \$2000 scholarships were available and; for school term 2009/10, 3 \$2000 scholarships were available.

PRESIDENT'S AWARD: This Award is presented to an individual in recognition of exemplary services to the Association of Professional Biologists of BC.

SCIENCE FAIR AWARDS: APB continues its support of the Canada Wide Science Fair and its Regional components. A monetary prize is presented to the best biological entry at the regional level when an RPBio member acts as a judge.
